Book Week

We had a busy Book Week where we enjoyed sharing books with our Year 2 reading buddies and parading with the rest of the school in our book character costumes.



Real-life superheroes

Wow! We were very lucky to have several visitors who help people including a midwife, two nurses, a vet and firefighters - with a fire engine that the children were able to explore! The siren and blue flashing lights caused much excitement. We learnt to ask questions and listen carefully in order to find out more about these important jobs. Thank you again to our kind visitors. Our superhero guests have inspired us to role-play being police officers, firefighters, nurses etc., we have built our own emergency vehicles and been busy mark making during our role-play with incident forms, posters, signs, labels and registration plates.



Gymnastics

We have started our gymnastics topic in our PE lessons and have been learning to use our bodies to make different shapes such as a star, pike, straddle, tuck, straight, front support and back support.



Maths

This term we have been busy mathematicians consolidating number bonds to 10, doubles to 10, exploring odd and even numbers; learning to name, recognise and use mathematical language to describe 3d shapes and explored more complex patterns.



Supertato

We enjoyed reading the story Supertato and helping the vegetables escape from the ice that Evil Pea had trapped them in. We explored how to melt the ice and help the veggies escape. We also created our own Superveg/ fruit characters and settings and adapted the story with our own ideas.



Superhero School

We started off our Superhero topic by learning all about how to be a superhero. We thought about our special superhero powers and how to help others. We made our own masks and took part in Superhero Gym.



On Sudden Hill

We have finished our half term topic reading 'On Sudden Hill' a story about friendship, dealing with disagreements and compromise. We explored using watercolour to paint rainy day pictures inspired by the story. Working as a team, we used our imaginations and made box creations such as a kitty police car, a robot, a fire engine, a giraffe racing car, a car boat, a bed bot and much more to use in our play.
