YEAR 1 NEWS

How can I join it?

We have been learning how to make joins in DT this half term. The children have experimented with flanges, tabs, braces, L braces, slots and concertinas. They have been evaluating designs around us such as water bottles and door handles and using their materials knowledge from science. They loved putting their skills together at the end of the unit to make trees structures.



Geography and our local area

We have been learning about our local area and understanding that Milford is a village and Godalming is a town. We talked about the different landmarks we know in our village and also went on a walk to see them.



Jack and the Beanstalk

We have loved immersing ourselves into the story of Jack. We have practised our retelling in different ways: using stick puppets, acting on our stage (and using the tree as a beanstalk!) and drawing story timelines. When talking about the giant's castle we have used different describing words. One of the words was gigantic! We also made huge castles with Duplo and beanstalks which we measured to see whose was the tallest!



Marvellous Maths

The children have been learning their number bonds to ten through matching activities, practical work and a lot of singing! They have enjoyed making and writing number lines and writing their own 100 square. They are starting to notice patterns in numbers which is wonderful to watch! We have now made the snack table a shop. The children are quite happy to pay for their snacks after learning about money and the different coins.



Materials

This half term we have been learning about materials. We have learned about different types of materials and investigated the properties of different materials, finding out that we can sort them into groups such as those which are smooth, spiky, rough and transparent.



Woodland day

We had another successful woodland day. The children did some watercolour paintings of their surroundings and enjoyed building dens for the woodland animals. They were happy to go on a longer walk and loved looking for animal clues, such as footprints and burrows.
