In maths, we have been exploring 2D shapes and deepening our understanding of the composition of numbers to 5, using hands-on activities to build strong early number skills.




Year 2 news



Maths


This term with have been adding and subtracting two 2-digit numbers and learning the value of money. We learnt how to use numberlines in a variety of ways to help solve calculations.
