

#### ART—We are resilient and artistic

The children in Year One have been developing their artistic skills over the year through sketching, colour mixing, sculpting and DT skills. After focusing on strong observational sketching, they produced these beautiful butterflies inspired by Austin's Butterfly. Some went on to rehearse these skills whilst doing some observational plant paintings. The children have really learnt to be resilient this year and often have a few attempts when trying to draw something.



#### **DRAMA and English**

As you can see from the photos, we have some rather sad looking faces. But do not worry, this is down to some mighty fine acting! When we looked at the text 'Augustus and his smile' we discussed how Augustus must have felt when he realised his smile had gone. We said he would have been sad, upset, unhappy and disappointed and we stepped into his shoes to show these feelings through our facial expressions and body language. Spoiler alert: after some searching in all manner of places, he finds his smile.



#### Let's be dramatic!!

After reading "Augustus and his Smile", we discussed different emotions and explored what they would look like through drama. The children focused on their body language and it helped them understand that we can describe more than just facial expressions. We had a lot of fun and it really deepened their connection to the character



#### Island fun.

The children in Year One designed, made and wrote about their own islands. We started our writing by making a class island and talking about all the features we would like; we had chocolate trees, water-falls and lots of animals! The children went on to write some lovely setting descriptions which you can enjoy reading over the holidays.



#### **Blue Reef Trip**

Thank you to all the parents that helped to make this trip so successful! The children we very excited to be going to the coast for the day and loved watching all the animal life in the aquarium. From stingrays to axolotls, hovercrafts to shark eggs, they were keen to know more. We were very proud of them during the shark talk as they listened intently and asked many interesting questions. Although we had a little rain, the cohort were happy playing on the beach, true Brits!





#### **Mary Anning**

We had such fun learning about Mary Anning and her fossil discovery. Did you know she was one of the first people to hunt for fossils? She discovered an Ichthyosaur which was more than 165 million years old. During our Mary Anning discovery day we hunted for fossils in the sand, created our own fossils using salt dough, created fossil collages, matched dinosaur skeletons to the dinosaur facts, read about Mary Anning and used this knowledge to create some super writing.



#### Team building at Rodborough school

Milford are so lucky to have been invited to Rodborough School to try out some team building exercises. Watching the children work together to get through hoops, balance on beams and lead them blindfolded was an experience. The Rodborough students were wonderful instructors and we were very proud of our school's engagement.



#### **Green fingers!**

We have continued to look after our veg beds with great enthusiasm and have enjoyed seeing our produce. Our strawberries are beginning to ripen, the herbs smell delicious, flowers and beans are growing and the vegetables are almost ready!



#### Maths

The children have been counting in 2's, 5's and 10's in many ways, including kicking a ball! They have been ordering numbers and sorting their shapes and having fun with numbers.

### YEAR R NEWS

#### Food, Glorious, Food!

We started our new topic by reading Handa's surprise By Eileen Brown. In the story, fruit is taken from a Handa's basket by some very cheeky animals. We loved role playing this story and really getting into character. We had taste testing sessions, trying all the different fruits in Handa's basket. We loved learning how to chop up the fruit carefully. Oak class made a tally chart of their favourite, mango was a clear winner!



What super mathematicians we have in Reception!

This term we have been building on the children's knowledge of number facts and applying this to sharing and grouping. Children have been participating in activities like sharing fruit or group games as opportunities for children to notice when things are fair. These practical activities help children see whether items have been shared equally and whether everyone has the same. The children have also been looking at different ways shapes can be turned and positioned to make different pictures.



#### PE

We have been working on our ball skills is PE. We have used a range of different sized balls and worked on our control and how to chase a moving ball. We love our PE sessions and learning about keeping fit and healthy.



#### Butterflies

We watched with awe and wonder when we released our butterflies. We learnt about the lifecycle of a butterfly.



#### **Tuesley Farm**

We were very lucky to visit Tuesley Farm this half term. We had so much fun – tractor rides, fruit picking and lots of playing. We even got to learn all about Bee colonies and how they make honey.



#### Writing

Early morning writing – We start our day with our morning writing activity. You can see how much we have been working on our sentences and letter formation.

We had so much fun bouncing around for the school bouncathon. We even tried out some of our gymnastic shapes from PE. Look how high we can jump!






