Spring in Year 2 – Fire!

Time flies when you're having fun in Year 2!

We have loved learning about the Great Fire of London and it has inspired us across the curriculum, from looking at historical evidence, to writing recounts and wonderful art work.



Rodborough Multi-sports

We had great fun at the Rodbough multi-skills event. We loved the sports leaders teaching us new games and skills.







DT

Our two DT projects this term explored structure, which involved looking at the shapes needed to make our 1666 houses, and learning about wheels and axles to make a moving vehicle.



<u>English</u>

Through our recount writing we have explored tenses, nouns, verbs, adjectives and adverbs, conjunctions and sentence structure. Writing in first person using emotion language and interesting description in our expanded noun phrases.



<u>Art</u>

Exploring hot and cold colours helped us create our mixed media Great Fire of London pictures. The children are becoming expert watercolour artists and enjoyed showing off their skills in beautiful Mothers Day cards.



<u>Maths</u>

We have learnt how to measure accurately in cm and m. Collected, recorded and interpreted data in tallies, tables, bar charts and pictograms. We have recapped the four operations $(+ - \div x)$ and used them to solve missing number problems.



<u>Music</u>

We have used a variety of instruments to create our own music, focusing on rhythms and maintaining a beat and we were wowed by our Rock Star friends in the Rocksteady Concert!



<u>Science</u>

We have learnt about food chains and used our scientific enquiry skills to explore the properties of materials.

History

We have looked at similarities and differences between life now and in 1666. We a used a range of evidence to build our knowledge of this significant event in British history.
